RECORD

Keep detailed records of the tenancy.

- Keep records of mid-tenancy issues including communications, bills and invoices.

COLLABORATE

- Invite tenants to the check-in and check-out to agree condition of the property.

- At tenancy end, agree on reasonable deposit deductions with your tenants.
- In the event of tenant transfers. work with tenants to update the inventory.
